### **SYNOPSIS**

Establishes certain restrictions concerning foods sold to pupils at public elementary and middle schools.

### **CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

Substitute as adopted by the Assembly Education Committee.

AN ACT establishing certain restrictions concerning foods sold to pupils at public elementary and middle schools and supplementing chapter 33 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. The Legislature finds and declares that:
- a. the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has declared that obesity, which affects 61% of American adults, and childhood obesity, which affects up to 15% of American children between the ages of six and 17, are epidemics in the United States;
- b. Congress has introduced the Improved Nutrition and Physical Activity Act (IMPACT Act) to address the overall concern with the obesity epidemic and, in particular, the need to educate youth about good nutrition, healthy eating habits, and the importance of physical activity;
- c. the United States Surgeon General has issued a report entitled "The Surgeon General's Call to Action to Prevent and Decrease Overweight and Obesity," which lists the treatment and prevention of obesity as a national priority, and the United States Department of Agriculture issued a report to Congress in which it recognized that foods without regulated nutrition standards are low in nutrient density and are higher in fat, added sugar, and calories; and
- d. health experts agree that one of the most effective ways to prevent obesity is to establish policies and programs that encourage children and adolescents to develop healthy eating habits that they can maintain throughout their lives.

- 2. a. No food of minimal nutritional value, as defined by the United States Department of Agriculture, shall be sold to a pupil at a public elementary or middle school while the pupil is on school property until at least one-half hour after the end of the school day.
- b. Before school opens and during school hours, a food item sold through a vending machine to a pupil at a public elementary or middle school:
- (1) shall be a whole grain, enriched or fortified grain or grain product, a fruit or vegetable, a nut or nut spread, a seed, a legume, a trail mix, a soy-based product, a milk or dairy product, an electrolyte-replacement beverage, 100% real fruit or vegetable juice, or water; and
- (2) shall not be a candy bar, a hard candy, chewing gum, or an item which consists of more than 35% sugar or other sweetener or more than eight grams of fat per serving.
- c. Home-baked goods sold for a fundraiser shall be exempt from the criteria set forth in this section.

1	3. Each vending machine in a public high school shall contain at
2	least one food item and one beverage which meet the dietary criteria
3	set forth in subsection b. of section 2 of this act.

4. The Secretary of Agriculture, in consultation with the Commissioner of Education, shall promulgate guidelines to implement the provisions of this act and shall monitor compliance of school districts with the provisions of this act.

5. Nothing in this act shall be construed to prohibit the Secretary of Agriculture, in consultation with the Commissioner of Education, or the board of education of a public school district from establishing more stringent nutritional policies for public school students.

6. This act shall take effect immediately, but shall not apply to vacate any contract existing prior to its enactment until the expiration of the original terms of the contract.
